The *Mission Worship* conference has a 25-year history and became part of Kingsway CLC Trust after the merger between *CLC UK* and the *Kingsway Trust* in 2019. It was established to share the move of God through worship that has arisen in recent decades and to give a platform for emerging worship leaders, as well as training, equipping and encouraging new leaders. Even as COVID-19 spread across the UK causing all Christian conferences to be cancelled, we maintained a hope that a November event would still be possible.

It was not to be - but God had other ideas!



Like so many Christian activities, churches and events, we moved online. Instead of a physical conference spread over three days, a one-day event over a ten-hour period was put together, and it was live-streamed on Saturday, November 21st. Preparing this was a steep learning curve!

Over the years, *Mission Worship* has enjoyed the generous support of many participants - Doug Williams

(our compere), Dr John Andrews (teaching) and Aaron Keyes (worship leader and songwriter), among others. Everyone connected with the event contributed to produce a series of videos full of spiritual content and glorious praise.

The day began with a worship session led by Jake Isaac and Lucy Grimble (Us & Him), which set the tone for a day centred on Jesus. Dr John Andrews shared a talk with us titled 'Held by Hope', a theme that continued in the evening.

In the second and third sessions, there was a mix of seminars and the introduction of new songs from a stunning array of songwriters - Glenn Packiam, Rend Collective, Noel Robinson, Clayton and Olivia Webb, Krissy Nordhoff, Lou Fellingham, Tim Timmons, Lucy Grimble, Keith and Kirsten

Getty, Sarah Kroger, Chris McClarney, Richard James Butt, Sandra McCracken and Pat Barrett. A feast! All shared with simplicity and humility, even when the recording was interrupted by a 'family event', such as helping a child in the middle of a song! It all combined to bring a sense of authenticity.

The day ended with worship led by Aaron Keyes and the Word of God shared by John Andrews. As Aaron sang - Hallelujah, you are worthy to receive all glory, all honour.

There has been some encouraging appreciation of the day:

MW20 was my best ever *Mission Worship* **experience** - I am really pleased it was not cancelled. There was such an awesome sense of God's presence. There was a real sense of the worship leaders playing to an audience of One without having to also focus on a perfect performance and all the factors that need to be taken into consideration with a concert or big stage event.

Being up close with the worship leaders, sharing their vulnerability and offering pure worship, made it such an intimate experience. The life settings, including the pink bedroom and having to open the playdough, did not detract but made the worship real as it flowed through and out of the realities of personal lives and situations.

I made it a day in His presence - I stayed in my bedroom for the entire time, and it was so good that I did not want to miss any of it so only took a break for dinner, fasting inadvertently.

Maybe you are disappointed to have missed Mission Worship? Well, the beauty of online events is that they can remain online. All of the sessions have been uploaded on **www.missionworship. com**. Do take the opportunity to check them out.

How are we to evaluate such a new and different experience? The physical events have always attracted hundreds of attendees. The online experience is undoubtedly different and, yet, the numbers speak for themselves - more than 7,500 people from at least 20 countries joined the live-streamed event at some point during the day; the YouTube Mission Worship channel has gained 1,600 new subscribers, and the collection of videos was viewed more than half a million times in 2020 alone.



It is clear that digital channels can enable us to connect with far more people spread around the world. Our mission is to encourage people in their spiritual walk, whatever their starting point. COVID-19 has forced us to look at new methods of communicating His message. Digital is not the only way, but it certainly opens up new opportunities 'to glorify God, and to enjoy Him forever'.

## **IN 2020 WE DID EVERYTHING – VIRTUALLY!**

Necessity is the mother of invention, they say. At some point during 2020, and into 2021, approximately 80% of all CLC's bookshops around the world have had to close for varying amounts of time. Obviously, this meant that most of our usual activity came to a halt. So, what could we do? The Lord stimulated our creativity, and a multitude of online activities flourished. Here are a few:

### Websites - Worldwide



Inevitably, book sales via our websites produced significant increases as bookshops were closed. We have at least 28 commercial websites around the world selling Bibles and books in many different languages.

The move towards buying online has been dramatically accelerated in the last year and this has given many CLC teams both the opportunity and urgency to improve their online shops. In this

image you can see the new website for CLC Peru, launched just last year - www.libreriaclcperu.com.

In the USA, CLC's Multi-Language Media website – www.multilanguagemedia.org - sells books in 91 different languages, from Afrikaans to Zulu, plus many you probably have not heard of!

In the Philippines, the team linked up with secular online channels, Shopee and Lazada, with very encouraging results. Around the world, we are learning to use not only our own website platform, but those of third parties as well. Most of the time these other channels reach a wider, more secular market.

#### Virtual Booktable – Portugal

A very 'normal' activity for CLC is to take booktables to one-off events at churches, conferences and bookfairs. Almost all of these were cancelled in 2020! In Portugal, Carlos Cunha decided to take the concept online. The Global Leadership Summit was held online over one and a half days. The speakers included Craig Groeschel, author and pastor of Life Church, Káká, the former football player, and Lysa Terkeust, president of Proverbs



31 Ministries. At the end of each presentation, the author's book appeared on the screen with a link to the CLC Portugal website. Carlos was active on the website chat so that he could interact directly with customers. Sales in leadership titles increased in the following days.

### Booksellers' Convention – Colombia & Latin America



Each year, several of our Latin American teams hold conventions specifically for booksellers in their country, giving opportunity for booksellers to meet publishers and hear of the new projects being released. By definition, this is a local event. As the Colombia team began to plan with the publishers, it became evident that it could be a multi-national event reaching far beyond the bookselling community to include the general public. As a

result, authors, publishers, conference speakers and worship leaders were all able to participate and present their ministries to a much wider audience. The outcome had spectacular results: 25 hours of varied material was transmitted right across Latin America and beyond, with more than 250,000 people accessing the various sessions. To say this exceeded expectation is an understatement!

In total CLC Colombia was able to offer 233 virtual events during 2020 covering a wide range of issues. Many of these can be seen on the CLC Colombia YouTube cwhannel which has almost 4,000 subscribers. There you can find a multitude of videos including a virtual book club, seminars examining the convergence of science and theology, author interviews and much more. For 2021, the motto for the YouTube channel is 'building with reverent fear'.

### **Prayer Meetings – Worldwide**

In 2020, the four-yearly CLC International Council was due to take place in Seoul, Korea. It was cancelled twice in 2020 and, even in 2021, it may take place as a virtual event. The international leadership was unable to travel to visit our national teams. However, a new phenomenon emerged - the online, global prayer meeting. In a single Zoom call, we were able to bring together 130 CLC team members from around 40 countries to share fellowship and pray together. We had never been able to gather together so many from the CLC family previously.

In a subsequent Zoom gathering we were able to 'meet' the author, Josh McDowell. It was a great opportunity to get to know a world-renowned author and, equally, Josh was able to see the international, multi-racial, multi-lingual family that is CLC.

### Writing Courses – Kenya

For a number of years, our National Director in Kenya, Muthoni Mercy Omukhango, has had the burden to train local authors. This focused on both adults and teenagers. Unable to continue the physical classes in 2020, Muthoni turned to the internet. She shares this:

The hard part of writing a book is not getting published. It is the actual writing. Books do not just write themselves after all. You have to invest everything you are into creating an important piece of work. Although writing is often a solitary act, the creative energy to write cannot thrive in a vacuum.

These courses run by CLC Kenya are preparing some of the African voices of the future.

### Month of the Bible – Worldwide

In June 2020, all CLC teams were asked to have a special focus on the Bible to counter the fear and confusion spread by COVID-19. A significant number of these Bibles were sold online with special promotions. In Canada, the CLC team in Montreal sold almost twice as many of one edition of the Bible in that month as they had in the whole of 2019. What a privilege to distribute the Word of God.

### Virtual Thompson Bible Seminars – Latin America

Regular readers of CLC World will be aware of the wonderful work being done in Latin America in collaboration with the *Thompson Bible Institute*. The aim is to instruct pastors and teachers in the use of the *Thompson Chain Reference Bible*, especially leaders unable to afford theological training. Properly used, this study Bible can open up a wealth of Bible teaching on hundreds of subjects. CLC has been able to partner with the Institute to train tens of thousands of Christian workers. Again, this appeared impossible under the restrictions of COVID-19. Ironically, the pandemic enabled us to reach more countries, not less. With some skilful re-ordering of the way the material was presented, the seminars continued through the year. In total, the virtual seminars enable the training of 800 people from ten countries, from Argentina to Spain.

### Social Media – Africa

With bookshops closed, some of our workers had more time on their hands to learn new skills. Our teams in Burkina Faso, Benin and Ivory Coast had not been very active with social media. With help from co-worker, Lionel Couret, in France via Zoom, our teams were helped to understand the potential of Facebook for their bookshops. The public responded very positively, and this new way of connecting with our customers will surely become the new normal.

### Hand in Hand Conference – UK

In February, the Hand in Hand Conference run by the Kingsway CLC Trust was live streamed. This conference aims to help those working in children's and family ministry – an area that has been particularly hard-hit by the pandemic. The topics included ministry in a post-



pandemic world and how to bring the presence of God into everyday family life. The online event was very well received and attended by over 1,300 people from several countries. Judging by the comments, people were very happy to engage with this online format.



### New Book Presentations – Italy

For a number of years, CLC Italy has steadily built up its presence on YouTube with a particular focus on presenting new titles. CLC Italy publishes many of its own titles, and these are frequently showcased on YouTube. This has become an increasingly important way of communicating with customers, particularly during lockdown. This can be done very simply from a bookshop setting, as if talking to a customer.

### Where does this leave us?

So, maybe we have not been able to open all of our bookshops all of the time. Maybe we have not been able to meet physically. Maybe there have been financial and emotional struggles. However, this brief overview is a reminder that we can still fulfil our God-given vision to enable people to progress in their spiritual journey. May the Lord help us to continue to look to Him to respond to whatever situation we find ourselves in and continue to reach out with our life-transforming resources.

hard, and the border with Italy was closed for many weeks. All non-essential shops were also closed. If we still had our shop near Lugano it would have been financially devastating for CLC. Instead, we have seen our on-line sales grow significantly since the pandemic hit.

WE PRAISE GOD that in His perfect will and timing, He has preserved our ministry in CLC Switzerland.

### MOZAMBIQUE

We are so thankful for 10,000 low-cost NIV Bibles which arrived at CLC Mozambique in February. They came just in time as our previous shipment of 10,000 affordable Bibles was running out! Please pray that these will be distributed widely in the country and that the good seed of the Word will be sown in many hearts. These Bibles contain an outline of the Gospel message, a prayer for salvation and details of how CLC can be contacted.
